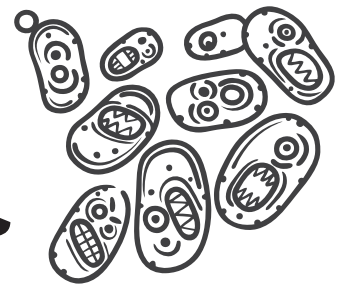
I'm a red blood cell and I carry oxygen from your lungs to all parts of your body.
